Again and again this family company turn out remarkable wines for modest prices. We loved the wine but doubts grew, as being so cheap-would you believe our inclusion in the Best Value Whites Und'r \$10.00? Then we came across this strong recommendation from the noted wine authority and distinguished show Judge, James Halliday: "It's an ill wind that blows no one any good, the quality and price of this wine partly reflects the surplus chardonnay grapes. It has aromas and flavours of stone fruits and a touch of spice; then fresh, focused and zesty on the finish. Score 89/100." The key is of course that as we drinkers have turned to sauvignon blanc, the chardonnay is left hanging on the vine, so along come the bargain hunters. Tough for growers but so be it! Prior to 2000 it was of course available in Australia but was enjoyed by few and sales spluttered along. Now it is our most popular white variety and dozens of beautiful wines arrive every month from Marlborough, New Zealand. We liked what we call the price to quality ratio of this wine as it provides easy, agreeable drinking at a modest price. We fail to see why you should pay \$5.00 to \$7.00 more just because the brand seems more familiar. Go back to the start of this story and reflect again on the fact that none of these wines were around 9 years ago. Because of the sensational value this wine offers it marches into our Best Value Whites Und'r \$10.00. The price is \$8.99 per bottle or \$107.88 when you buy a dozen.

All of this fruit is processed at the Wynns winery from the best such as John Riddoch right the way down to this Jamiesons. The point being that this is very good wine indeed made by great professionals, at a famous winery, perhaps from lesser fruit but this is better than most other Coonawarra wineries have anyway.

Secrets of Blending Shearers Lament Cabernet Shiraz 2006

You will love this wine so let us tell you about it! If wine has a holy grail it is to find good tasty reds with full flavour that do not cost too much. This gem comes from a small Barossa Valley based firm that spends its time tasting hundreds of bulk samples and thinks about how the ones they like can be dramatically improved by judicious blending with small amounts of other wines that cost a lot more. Here is how it works. A wine was found at Cockatoo Ridge by a very gifted winemaker from McLaren Vale, Justin Lane who told the Barossa boys and it forms the base of the Shearers Lament. After discussion with Justin a sensational parcel of McLaren Vale petit verdot was added. This wine poured like dark, blood coloured oil and an instant improvement was noted. Next a heavy Barossa shiraz was added and the job was done. As a day to day quaffer, this wine will give you great drinking satisfaction. Try it and see why.

Rich & Full Flavoured Taylors Clare Valley Shiraz

One of our Clare favourites is this richly flavoured, deeply coloured Taylors. While the Clare Valley, like most of the vineyard regions of South Australia was opened up in the mid Nineteenth Century, it fell into a long slumber. A small revival began when Australians embraced red wines in the 1960's just when all seemed lost. Taylors began its Clare adventure in 1969 at the Southern end of the Clare Valley near the town of Auburn. Just to show you how long it takes to get a business going it's only in the last decade that they have moved into top gear. Part of the reason is the top winemaking talent they have attracted. It shows in wines such as this which are deeply coloured, rich and vibrant and in our view very fair value.

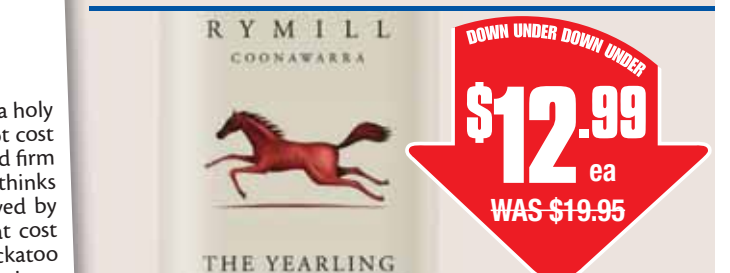

We recall selling a rival brand, Jamiesons Run in the year 2000 for \$12.99 so not much has happened with prices since then. Of the two red varieties cabernet and shiraz its probably cabernet that makes the greatest of Coonawarra reds, notwithstanding many sensational shiraz's that have come from the district.

Comes in from the Cold at Last Wild Oats Pinot Grigio 2008

Pinot Grigio or pinot gris makes a lovely wine, quite delicate and with a soft lingering fruitiness. It's been out there all the time though only in the last few years have we swung to its beguiling flavours. This variety has always been loved by Italians and its knowledge spread with them as they migrated around the world. Thus the Italian tobacco farmers of the King Valley, Victoria, when they switched to other agriculture, planted vines and introduced favoured Italian varieties such as nebbiolo, prosecco, and pinot grigio. Then bit by bit the word has spread. This is what the Oatley family say about this wine: "Whilst we were aiming for a more Italian reflection of... we tried to also capture varietal fruitiness, some texture along with the lively, zesty nature of the natural acidity. Produced with not so much of a whiff of oak, this is a delightful alternative to chardonnay and with its inherent fruitiness, a great substitute for sauvignon blanc."

Humble Price - Great Wine Hardy Sir James Brut N.V.

A very tasty wine and a showcase brand for the Hardy Company. Of all the wine styles made it is sparkling wine of which it can be said it is made in the winery. Sure you need cool climate fruit of a certain type and to mirror the famous French sparkling wine Champagne you must use chardonnay and pinot noir but after that you need advanced technical skills. For a young country we have been making sparkling wines for a very long time, about 120 years. The first major attempt was by Hans Irvine of Great Western after he purchased the winery in 1887. Hans with Frenchman he employed were our first sparkling wine experts. The next was Leo Buring who worked at Minchinbury, Sydney from about 1901 to 1919. Some now say though that the greatest is Ed Carr who makes the Sir James wines. Try a bottle and find out how great this wine is.

The blend to rival Marlborough

West Cape Howe Semillon Sauvignon Blanc

The New Zealand district of Marlborough, maker of fabulous sauvignon blanc's does not have it all its own way. From the mid 1970's a few wineries in W.A. in the Margaret River region began to experiment by blending the two varieties semillon and sauvignon blanc. Much to their amazement they found that two plus two did equal five, and a new taste was discovered. Some continue to define this blend and some are now making sauvignon blanc the dominant variety. Cape Howe continues with this semillon dominant blend as it makes the taste result firmer and gives the wine more length. This winery is though further east of Margaret River in an area called the Great Southern thus expect another slight shift in the taste profile. Bottom line is a wine of energy and style. For your fact book, West Cape Howe uses the Seahorse as an emblem on their labels. It is thought the first public aquarium display of this unusual fish was in May, 1859, in London.

Kim Crawford Sauvignon Blanc

What can we say but you do get a better taste at a higher price with this wine. The wonderful sauvignons from Marlborough, New Zealand are now giving Australian drinkers a great deal of pleasure. Perhaps no other grape variety should be made into wine in the simplest way possible, in a manner to capture the flavours that have developed in the ripening grape. Making good sauvignon is about capturing all of this delicious, fruit flavour. There are not many variables apart from sun and water so in a general sense they all taste remarkably similar. A lower crop will though pack more grape flavour into each bottle. Thus wines such as this do taste better than cheaper versions-note this does not apply across the board-but only you can decide how much more to pay makes sense for you.

We knew we had to support this new innovative wine. You never know when a company takes a gamble whether it will please consumers. Well the Wolf Blass winemakers are at it again; this time with a low alcohol (11.5%), light dry red, with a touch of spritz to keep it lively and a wine they would like us to serve chilled. At times in summer it is so hot at lunch that this could be just the wine we need. An Australian extension of Spanish Sangria or Beaujolais Nouveau if you will, both of which are best served chilled. Hopefully Verae fills the void which is now being filled by rose and sparkling burgundy neither of which is really the right thing. It is though not a new idea, rather one whose time may have arrived. Incidentally the grapes are sourced from the Limestone Coast where very fine grape of the highest quality are grown.

It's fair to say that our budget sparkling wines are twice as good as they were a decade or so ago. The main reasons-better grapes from cooler growing regions and better technical skills. Making delicate, fine, tasty sparkling wines requires a higher level of technical skills than for table wines. Many say the best operator in Australia is Ed Carr who makes this Omni. Our history of making world class sparkling wines stretches back to 1887 when Hans Irvine began at Great Western and continued with greats like Leo Buring at Minchinbury. So 120 years on Ed Carr works his magic and as we often say the results of tinkering with the very expensive wines work their way down the tree to improve more humble offerings such as this Omni. This wine offers very good value and it's nice to know is the end product of a lot of spit and polish, going back a very long way.

Not only did Tyrrells make the first commercial chardonnay in Australia (they did exist previously but were given other names or not recognised for the variety) in 1971 but they now are leading the way in giving us a fresher, gentler, crisper, though fruity style, with little or no oak which is just right for our warm climate. We believe this is a very tasty wine to have in the house as the summer approaches.

Included in our Best Value Whites Und'r \$10.00 because the chardonnay is very great value. We purchased this wine from a small group who work in the Barossa Valley. While they did not make the components of the wine they carefully buy small parcels from numerous growers, some of whom are desperate to sell we sadly add, and after many trials re-blend these parts into a final wine. This is their art form and it shows in this delicious and very budget conscious final wine. And having a sense of mischief they liken this to rounding up a flock of galahs and getting them to fly in the same direction. We may add that a great deal of bulk chardonnay is being shipped off-shore, much to the U.S. where it is bottled up as 'Three Buck Koala'. They love the taste of our chardonnay in the U.S. Please note this chardonnay is made in the modern way of crisp, fresh varietal flavours with no oak and is well removed from the larger, often very fat wines of yesterday.

The world stronghold was Northern Italy and many of us have tried their Pinot Grigio's, most of very indifferent quality. Yet some of our winemakers could see a future and one was T'Gallant on the Mornington Peninsula. It seems to be the way that a few pioneers persevere for years or decades, a core band of follower's forms, and then it rolls out to a wider audience. So now the venerable Hardy's offer us a delicious and keenly priced example and have placed it under another of their famous brands, Nottage Hill. We would like you to try this wine as you will see the varietal excitement without risking much money. Superior winemaking skills made us include this in our Best Value Whites Und'r \$10.00.

Crisp and lively, it has authentic tropical/kiwi fruit sauvignon blanc flavours backing up the grassy/lemony Semillon; soft acidity follows on the clean finish." He gave it a point score of 89/100. Well that is a fine endorsement for a wine at this price point particularly when you find wines that score one or two points more can sell for over \$20.00. We prefer to keep the other \$15.00 in the bank, thank you. And please recall many of the world's greatest white wines are made from chardonnay and none of the world's great white wines are made from sauvignon blanc.

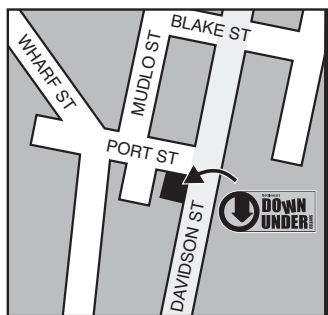

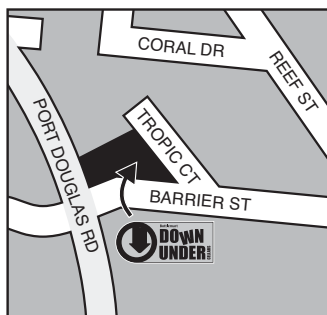

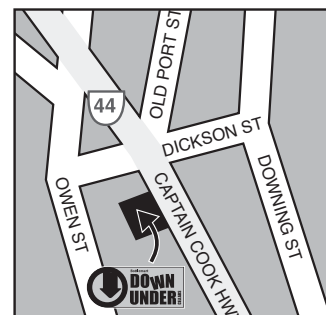
